

Tortoise Energy Infrastructure Total Return Fund (TORIX/TORTX/TORCX)

The fund invests primarily in equity securities of energy infrastructure companies that process, store, transport, and market natural gas, natural gas liquids, refined products, and crude oil (i.e., midstream infrastructure) as well as generate, transport, and distribute electricity (i.e., power and renewable infrastructure). The Tortoise Energy Infrastructure Total Return Fund focuses on the large and diverse North American pipeline universe.

The TORIX Advantage



Investing in the World's Largest Infrastructure Network

The U.S. position as the world's largest energy producer is expected to grow given rising demand for energy, energy exports, and growth in electricity. The fund invests in companies supporting this growth.



Real Asset Exposure with Inflation Alignment

By emphasizing investing in infrastructure generating cash flow from fee-based sources (often with inflation escalators), we believe the fund will be more resilient than commodity-driven peers through business and interest rate cycles.



Tax-Efficient Yield Delivery

Structured as a Regulated Investment Company (RIC), the fund distributes income via a 1099 (no K-1s) and avoids the double taxation that affects C-Corp funds.



Built for Total Return and Income

The fund targets higher current income than traditional energy funds by investing in cash-generative energy businesses.



Positioned for What's Next

With a structural focus on natural gas, natural gas liquids (NGLs), and U.S. energy exports, the fund is aligned with long-term global trends in energy reliability, security, electrification, and industrial reshoring, not just oil prices.

Investment Process

Through its in-house research coverage of companies throughout the entire energy value chain, Tortoise Capital's investment process uses a bottom-up, fundamentals-based approach. Tortoise Capital believes its process is a competitive advantage, allowing it to evaluate risk and reward intelligently across the energy infrastructure universe.

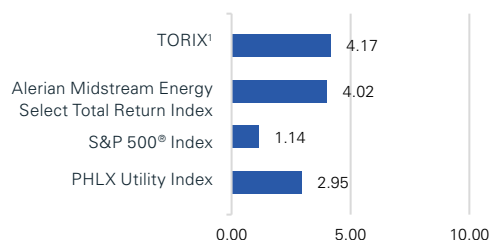

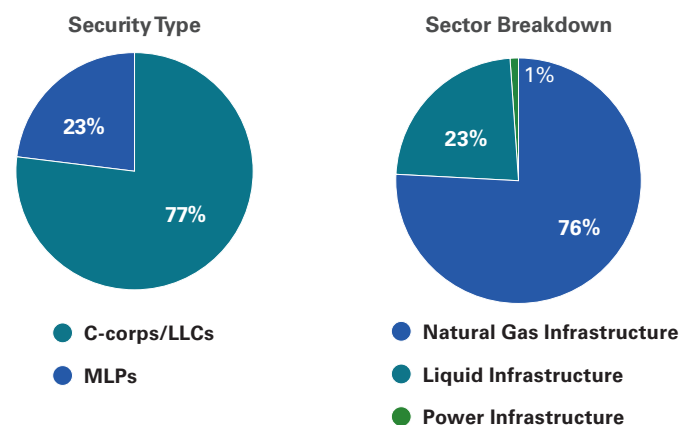

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The Morningstar Rating[™] for funds, or "star rating," is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history without adjustment for sales load. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive five stars, the next 22.5% receive four stars, the next 35% receive three stars, the next 22.5% receive two stars, and the bottom 10% receive one star. The Overall Morningstar Rating[™] for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five- and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating[™] metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36 - 59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60 - 119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. As of 3/31/2026, TORIX/TORTX/TORCX was rated against the following number of Energy Limited Partnership Funds over the following periods: 90, 90 and 66 for the three-year, five-year and 10-year time periods, respectively.
